

Directions to White Oak Township Community Building
202 N. Lincoln Street, Carlock, IL 61725

From the east (Bloomington/Normal) via I-74: Take I-74 west to Carlock Exit 120. Turn right at the exit stop sign. Drive past the Carlock Grade School and turn left onto Lincoln Street. Follow Lincoln Street past the fire station to the community building.

From the east (Bloomington/Normal) via U.S. Route 150: Take Route 150 west, which becomes Washington Street in Carlock. Continue east on Washington Street across the railroad tracks (do not follow Route 150 as it curves to the north). After crossing the railroad tracks, drive past Heartland Bank and turn right onto Lincoln Street. Follow Lincoln Street past the fire station to the community building.

From the west (Peoria area) via I-74: Take I-74 east to Carlock Exit 120. Turn left at the exit stop sign. Drive over I-74 past the Carlock Grade School and turn left onto Lincoln Street. Follow Lincoln Street past the fire station to the community building.

From the west (Congerville/Goodfield/Deer Creek area) via U.S. Route 150: Take Route 150 east into Carlock. Just beyond the old grain elevator, turn right and cross the railroad tracks onto Washington Street. Drive past Heartland Bank and turn right onto Lincoln Street. Follow Lincoln Street past the fire station to the community building.

Look for a “WILD ONES PLANT SALE” sign at the corner of Washington St. and Lincoln St. Plan to enter the community building through the door at the northeast corner of the building. There will be a “ENTER BLDG” sign, with an arrow pointing toward the entrance door, posted at the east end of the building. An “EXIT ONLY” sign will be posted at the building’s south double doors.

Parking is somewhat limited on the north, west and south sides of the community building. Additional parking is available at the Carlock Elementary School south of the community building. Parking is not allowed along Lincoln St. since it is posted as a fire lane. Please do not park in front of the fire station where the “No Parking” signs are located.
